

## **Guide for Authors**

**Please follow the following to prepare the article according to the journal style:**

1. Please upload your article in Microsoft word and take care of the following:
  - a. Must be blinded i.e. without authors names and their affiliations.
  - b. Leave 2.5 cm at upper, lower, right, and left sides of the page.
  - c. Use Times New Roman in the writing.
  - d. Use font 12 for all the manuscript except the title with a font of 14.
  - e. Leave only one line between the two adjacent lines.
  - f. Please put the figures and table in their appropriate places within the main manuscript file.
2. Please provide the title page which should consist of the following:
  - A. Main title of the manuscript
  - B. Running title (not more than 40 character)
  - C. Full detail of the corresponding author and other authors (name, affiliation, phone number, e-mail, ORCID).
    - a. Declaration section
    - b. Acknowledgements
    - c. Ethics approval and consent to participate
    - d. Consent for publication
    - e. Availability of data and material
    - f. Competing interests
    - g. Funding
    - h. Authors' contributions
3. The length of the article is 3000-3500 word.
4. Editing and English language: Should be readable and easy to follow.
5. Title:
  - a. Short and attractive.
  - b. Reflects the content of the article.
  - c. The first letter of each word should be started with a capital letter.
  - d. Avoid the abbreviation.
6. Abstract:
  - a. Can withstand alone.
  - b. Should be fractionated into: Background, objectives, materials and methods, results, and conclusion.
7. Keywords:
  - a. Reflect the article. They are usually obtained from the title.
  - b. Each keyword should be started with a capital letter and separated from each other with a semicolon.
8. Introduction:
  - a. Descriptive part.
  - b. Challenging part.
  - c. Objectives of the study.
9. Materials and methods:

- a. Study design.
- b. Place of the study.
- c. Duration of the study.
- d. Ethical approval.
- e. Informed consent.
- f. Definition of the problem.
- g. Inclusion and exclusion criteria.
- h. Calculation of the sample size.
- i. Detail of experiment, operation, etc...
- j. Data information
- k. Statistical analysis.

10. Results:

- a. Should be related to the methodology section.
- b. Not more than 8 tables or/and figures.
- c. The figures and tables should be readable without reading the text.
- d. The text should be appropriate and explained fully the figures and tables.

11. Discussion:

- a. Strength or main outcomes of the study.
- b. Discussion of the results with other studies (both nationally and internationally). The authors should give an explanation of these comparisons.
- c. The authors should avoid repetition of the results unless they are so important.
- d. Limitations to the study.

12. Conclusion:

- a. Should be according to the results of the study. not a repetition of other studies.
- b. Should be concise and informative.
- c. The authors might need to mention recommendations for further studies.

13. References:

- a. From highly impact journals.
- b. 30 in number.
- c. Follow the journal style (IEEE).
- d. Using Mendeley software in writing the references.
- e. Recent references (within the last 5 years) should be at least 50% of the total references.
- f. The authors should not miss key references.
- g. Avoid too much self citation.

## **Article Processing Fee**

## **Ethical consideration**

1. The article must not be submitted at the same time to other journals or under peer review process by another journal.
2. The submitted article is subjected to Turnitin software to detect any plagiarism. The article will be rejected immediately if the rate of the plagiarism  $\geq 20$  or any reference  $> 4\%$ .
3. Institutional ethical approval should be provided.
4. Informed consent from every patient should be taken for prospective studies.
5. You must take into consideration the ethical considerations regarding animal experimentation.
